

What are the EQF levels?

EQF: a model to compare

learning outcomes in

different countries





8 EQF levels

- Level 2: Basic factual knowledge of a field of work or study
- Level 3: Knowledge of facts, principles processes and general concepts,
 is a field of work or study
- Level 4: Factual and theoretical knowledge in broad contexts within a field of work or study
- Level 5: Comprehensive, specializes, factual and theoretical knowledge within a field of work or study and an awareness of the boundaries of that knowledge





Level 2 – Blacksmith trainee

- Applying basic techniques of metalwork and forging
- Works under supervision

- 1. Preparing forging work
- 2. Manufacturing forging work
- 3. Assembling forging work/constructions
- 4. Measuring & checking the manufactured ironwork








Level 3 - Blacksmith

- Applying basic techniques of metalwork and forging
- Responsible for his tasks
- More autonomy, responsibility and complexity than level 2
- Same competence units as level 2, but different learning outcomes

- 1. Preparing forging work
- 2. Manufacturing forging work
- 3. Assembling forging work/constructions
- 4. Measuring and checking the manufactured iro








Level 4 - Blacksmith team leader

- Applying basic and advanced techniques of metalwork and forging
- Responsible for the tasks of the team

- 1. Preparing forging work
- 2. Manufacturing forging work
- 3. Measuring and checking the manufactured ironwork
- 4. Managing the work
- 5. Guiding team members
- 6. Advising customers







Level 5 - Blacksmith specialist / Blacksmith owner

- Applying advanced and specialised techniques of metalwork and forging
- Manages a team, department and/or company

- 1. Product design and manufacturing
- 2. Entrepreneurship
- 3. Restauration forging
- 4. Art forging
- 5. Forging ship fittings
- 6. Manufacturing specific tools
- 7. Damascus forging
- 8. Forging with different materials
- 9. Forging locksmith work
